WARNING AGAINST RAGGING

Students are forbidden from ragging. Affected students must report all instances of ragging. They shall write a complaint & drop the letter into the Complaint Box kept in the office.

Ragging is a serious Criminal Offence that attracts severe punishment in the form of Dismissal from the College and Police action resulting in being jailed.

DO NOT RAG AND GET RAGGED

TAMIL NADU PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT 1997

S.A. College of Arts & Science strictly adheres to the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1997 and “Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009” (for more details see www.ugc.ac.in). It has taken adequate and necessary measures to curb the menace of Ragging in our institution completely. A multiple mechanism is made to ensure a ragging – free campus.

The measures undertaken as per the UGC directives are as follows-

I. Basic Measures :

- Anti-Ragging Boards are prominently displayed with the email and contact number of the Nodal officer of the Anti-ragging Committee in our College website and Campus area like College Office, Canteen and all common facilities area.
- Anti-ragging warning in the institution’s prospectus and information booklet/brochures are issued to all stakeholders.
- In compliance with the UGC Regulations and its 2nd Amendment regarding submission of undertaking by each student and every parent, an online undertaking in every academic year.

- The UGC has notified 3rd Amendment in UGC Regulations on 29th June, 2016 to expand the definition of ragging by including the following
- “3. (i) Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic, place of birth, place of residence or economic background”.
- All vantage points are installed with CCTV cameras for proper monitoring against any form of ragging.

II. Counseling and Monitoring Measures

- We follow regular interaction and counselling with the students and detect early signs of ragging and identifying the trouble-triggers.
- Routine and Surprise monitoring and inspection at Canteens, rest cum recreation rooms, toilets, bus-stops and any other measures that auger well in preventing/quelling ragging and uncalled for behaviour/incident are undertaken.

III. Creative Dissemination of the idea of Ragging – free Campus

- Events like Anti-ragging Workshops, seminars and other Creative avenues are used to spread the ideas.
- Safety and Security Apps, WhatsApp Groups without affecting the privacy of the individual are creatively deployed. The following Act of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly received assent of the Governor on the 14th February 1997 and is hereby published for general information.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT OF WOMEN AT WORKPLACE (PREVENTION, PROHIBITION AND REDRESSAL) ACT

Policy Statement :

S.A. College of Arts & Science has a zero-tolerance policy with respect to sexual harassment.

It includes all genders under this policy. A PoSH brochure is issued in this regard.

1. Harassment

The fundamental difference between harassment and fun is whether the person on the receiving end is feeling uncomfortable/abused or not. Even if the perpetrator did not intend it in that way. Intent does not matter. Impact matter.

2. Preventive measures

Being mindful of one's action and its impact can go a long way in preventing harassment. For example, maintaining a safe distance, avoiding physical contact etc. Conscious decision must be made. Eg. Whether to share personal information or join a group. A firm no at the first instance will be the best way to handle abuse. Talking to a confidant or a teacher immediately after the first instance.

3. Code of Conduct

Work place ethics, Do's and Don't for students and staffs

(i) Students

- Do not tease, abuse others by word, writing or action.
- Do not give or receive phone numbers or other e-contact identities to unknown persons.
- Do not share somebody else's contact information to anyone unless they ask you to do so
- Do not Gossip or Spread Rumours

- Respect and maintain personal space
- In case of difficulty approach the lady teachers in your department, then Principal.

(ii) Staff

- Treat all student equally without gender bias
- In case of indiscipline talk to the students in the presence of teachers or staff from both genders.
- Discipline and Decorum should be maintained at all times.
- Respect personal space.
- Respect and maintain confidentiality in case of complaint.
- Do not Gossip or Spread Rumours
- Do not use abusive language or action
- Do not ask for personal information unless absolutely essential.
- Do not share personal contacts of students
- Insist on letter from concerned staff in case students need OD
- For any non-academic activity make sure teachers of both genders are present and the proceeding are transparent and safe.

4. Advisory for non-academic activities

Prior permission must be obtained from the Principal and the HoD/Coordinators of the participating students for any practice/event whether it is within the college or outside. Presence of teaching staffs of both genders from the shift to which the students belong is mandatory.

5. Awareness

Of the types of harassment under PoSH Act and Punishments

- Verbal – Sex based comments, inappropriate description of person, starting sex-based rumours etc.
- Physical – inappropriate touching, patting, pinching etc.
- Visual-Sexual gestures, provocative gestures, leering, ogling, etc.
- Written provocative writing or sketching
- Cyber – unwanted repeated calls, invitation, sending of pornographic material etc.

6. Empowerment

Empowerment can be given only by giving a safe environment. Acting promptly on complaint, maintaining strict confidentiality.

Complaint and redressal in different level complain to the person in charge like class teacher or HoD/Coordinator. The next level of complaint should be given to the Principal.

POCSO

When the victim is a minor

It should be noted that under the POCSO act all the clauses of harassment are the same. However, since the victim is a minor the case must be immediately handed over to the police. It should also be noted that under the POCSO act anybody can make a complaint and not reporting the abuse/harassment of a minor can attract fines and imprisonment of upto 6 months.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Students are advised to greet faculty members and other superiors on campus when they happen to see them.
- When a lecturer enters the classroom, all the students should stand and greet him/her. They should take their seats only when they are asked to do so. Likewise, students should stand when the teacher leaves the room.
- During working hours, no students are allowed to leave the classroom or enter without the permission of the teacher.
- During working hours, students shall avoid loitering on the verandas and college campus.
- When moving from one class to another, students should walk silently and in an orderly manner.
- Students are expected to read the notices put up on the boards regularly. Failing to do so and claiming that he/she does not know about the information posted on the college notice board is not excused at any cost.
- Students should dress modestly and decently while coming to college. The dress code for students is to be strictly followed. T-shirts, short tops, and tight-fitting dresses are not allowed.
- Mobile phones are strictly prohibited. If found with students, the mobile phone will be confiscated.
- The cleanliness of the college building, furniture, and surroundings would be the personal responsibility of every student. Let the walls, furniture, floor, and premises be kept clean.
- No student of the college shall be a member of any association or club not connected with the college; without the prior permission of the principal, nor can they take part in any anti-social activities of any kind.

- As per the education rules laid down by the government, the principal has full power to inflict the following punishments : a fine, a suspension, and an expulsion from the college.
- Those who happen to come late to the college should meet the principal before entering the class.
- Students should not wear jewellery or other valuable materials. It will not be returned if it is seized by college.

Attendance

- Although the University prescribes a minimum of attendance to be permitted to sit for the University Examinations, the college insists on regular attendance in the classes.
- No Student will be allowed to absent themselves from the college without valid reasons. They must apply for leave in advance stating the reasons thereof.
- In cases where absence is due to unforeseen circumstances, an application of leave should be submitted as soon as possible. In case of failure, the student will not be permitted to the class.
- All leave letters should be countersigned by the parent or guardian in the case of day-scholars and by the Warden of the Hostels in the case of residents.
- Students should not absent themselves from the internal assessment or any tests conducted in the college.
- Submission of the assignments and conduct of seminars is compulsory.
- Students who happen to absent themselves without authorized leave will meet the Principal prior to attending class on their return to the college.

Library Rules

- The library is a place for individual study and research. Students are requested to maintain an atmosphere of dignity, peace, and silence within the library premises.
- Members are requested to handle the library reading materials with the utmost care. Mutilation, writing, scribbling, marking, and cutting pages will be severely dealt with.
- Users are requested to bring their ID cards issued by the institution while visiting the library. The ID card is a must for borrowing library books and is not transferable.
- All members are requested to keep their personal belongings at the property counter at their own risk. The library is not responsible for any loss or damage.
- Use of personal stereos, music sets, and mobile phones are not permitted inside the library.
- Taking food items, drinks, and other unwanted things to the library is not allowed, and if anyone is found not following these rules, they will be severely punished.
- Faculty members can borrow 04 books, non-teaching staff members can borrow 02 books, and UG students are eligible to borrow 03 books. The books should be returned by the due date.
- The borrowers are requested to check the books and other reading materials thoroughly for any missing pages, chapters, damages, markings, etc. before borrowing.
- Borrowers' books in damaged condition will not be accepted by the library. If any book is found mutilated and spoiled, the borrower must replace it.

- Borrowing privileges may be restricted or suspended in the event of misbehaviour or misuse of library facilities or materials.
- The institute smart ID card used for borrowing library materials is not transferable, and it must be produced whenever requested by library staff.
- Borrowers are responsible for all items issued in their name until they return them to the library.
- Faculty and staff members who are going on long leave, with or without salary, deputation, study leave, or extraordinary leave, will have to return all borrowed materials before leaving the institute.
- No material from the library should be taken out without proper issuance or recording. Any type of violation may lead to disciplinary action.

SACAS Book Bank Scheme

- The SACAS Book Bank Scheme is fully funded by the management. It was started on 15th July, 2022. The scheme has been implemented to endow a collection of undergraduate level textbooks to the meritorious, needy and underprivileged students.
- As per the scheme, a student can borrow up to 4 books from this collection for a period of one semester.
- The library issues a circular in the beginning of every semester which includes the necessary information and application link to avail the benefit as per the library rules. It is also available on our college website.
- Eligible students are advised to make use of the opportunity wisely.

Scholarships and Concession

Our college students can avail themselves of scholarships given by the government of Tamil Nadu and other trusts. Fee concessions and scholarships are given to needy and deserving students. To obtain these scholarships, students should apply in the prescribed form.

The Government of Tamil Nadu sanctions scholarships for Adi-Dravidar (SC) and Scheduled-Tribe (ST) students. These scholarships must be obtained through the proper channels from the district collector.

Fee :

- College fees should be paid on or before the prescribed date to avoid additional late fees.
- Delay in payment of fees is liable to a fine which would be Rs. 1,000/- and will be increasing in a progressive way every 15 days.
- The dates are applicable for both Tuition fee and Transport fee.
- Parents should not expect continuous reminders and extension of fee payment dates indefinitely.
